I am pleased to tell you that your research paper has been accepted for publication in The Lancet, subject to agreement over any editorial changes we may make.

It is likely that your submission will be substantially edited after acceptance to ensure it is accurate, clear, and understandable to a wide readership. You will receive a proof from a named editor. That proof should be corrected and returned within 48 hours.

The Lancet offers a choice of Gold Open Access and Green Open Access to authors whose research is funded by the following institutions: Wellcome Trust; any of the UK Research Councils, such as the Medical Research Council; Cancer Research UK; Arthritis Research Campaign; British Heart Foundation; UK Department of Health; UK Chief Scientist Office; UK Department for International Development; Dunhill Medical Trust; Motor Neuron Disease Association; Telethon (Italy); and Austrian Science Fund. Your paper has been funded by one of those institutions and we therefore ask you to make a choice below.

Green Open Access is the process of posting the accepted but unedited copy of your article (accepted author manuscript) to a public repository after an embargo period. We have set this embargo period at 6 months. At this point (6 months after publication) we will also make the published version of the article free to access. Unlike the gold open access model, there are no fees for the author to pay under the green model of open access. Please find below the link to the journal publishing licence agreement which will need to be completed if you choose to publish under Green Open Access.

Gold Open Access publication provides readers immediate access to articles published on the publisher's website. All material is published under a choice of three different Creative Commons licensing, with copyright retained by the authors. A publishing fee of US \$5000 is levied to cover editorial and production costs amongst others. Please note that if you choose to proceed with Gold Open Access you will hereby take responsibility for the article publishing fee.
